Due to the controversial, sensitive and serious nature of this work, the author wishes to underscore certain precious principles which guide his efforts. It is not, nor has it ever been his goal to ridicule, preach hatred or call for the destruction of any religion or faith by human hands. This author believes in the right and freedom of the individual to believe and worship according to the dictates of one's conscience and the right to free speech, especially of a critical nature. On the other hand, this work was motivated by a relentless desire to uncover truth. Where this search led and what the search was to uncover was an unknown factor at the outset of this undertaking. If any reader is 'offended' by the facts exposed and the publishing of this author's inquiry and findings or is in disbelief as to the truth of its contents, the author strongly suggests the reader pursue an independent investigation, publishing one's rebuttal to his evidence and arguments.

The author also wishes to state at the outset his belief that by far the majority of people who share the Roman Catholic faith are caring, loving and lawabiding citizens. Many have died selflessly for our country in the fight to maintain our sovereignty with the many freedoms we enjoy today. Their contribution to society and compassion for their fellow man is frequently manifested in good works which are often exceptional. Their zeal, sincerity and work ethic is often beyond reproach and admirable. Thus, this book is not an attempt to personally smear or attack the integrity of the Faithful within the Roman Catholic Church. It is rather an examination into the truthfulness of the many spiritual claims by the Church hierarchy and its leader, the Roman Pontiff. If they are not telling the truth, of what import is that fact to its worldwide congregation and the other professing Christians, who do not necessarily share their spiritual and political views, but share their belief in certain fundamental creedal truths? And what do the unbiased facts of history and public Church documents mean in the context of the 'big picture' regarding the destiny of the Church, the Body of Christ, as revealed in God's Word? Is the first stage of the Second Coming of Christ imminent? Is the 'secret' Rapture about to take place? Is Antichrist about to emerge out of the 'Revived Roman Empire?' Is Church unity under the umbrella of Ecumenism a good thing, encouraged by Jesus and the Apostles?

how this book came to be written

When the author became a Christian some nine years ago, by the sovereign grace of the Lord, it was not his intent to make a 'career move' into full-time research and writing, expending thousands of dollars with little to no income generated. Instead, spreading the Good News seemed a reasonable and passionate objective. Early on in his Christian walk the author was made aware of the controversy over 'tongues.' Advocates on both sides of the issue brought forth their arguments pro and con, without resolving their differences. This controversy sparked a deeper question in the mind of the author, 'How is it Christians can be divided over spiritual issues if the Holy Spirit is their Teacher?' Next, the author became fascinated with the subject of Prophecy and Eschatology. Indoctrinated into the 'Scofield' school of seven dispensations and Futurism, this writer eagerly awaited the Rapture with the best. Having no background in Theology as a new believer, the doctrine of Free-Will reigned supreme, although it must be admitted the author could not logically reconcile the many seemingly conflicting scriptures expressing the sovereignty and free-will of God over all His creatures versus the free-will and responsibility of man.

In addition, a thirst and quest for spiritual knowledge led the author to request and receive materials from ministries across the nation. Asking questions proved fruitless, as those with more knowledge and experience easily reproved any disquieting thoughts the author had. Thus, with

absolutely no previous background in research or knowledge of secular history, Church history and Roman Catholicism, this writer was moved to find the truth for himself, starting from proverbial 'scratch.' The results of years of study have uncovered terrifying and shocking truths. Truths which must be shouted from the housetops, not subverted as they have been for two centuries.

William Tyndale, the English martyr and first Bible translator to use the Greek text in writing and publishing his English language Bible, is little known both for his contribution to the Christian Church and the ensuing King James Bible. Mr. Daniell deftly exposes the fallacy of King James cultists by explaining Tyndale's 1534 New Testament to be the basis of both the Geneva and King James versions.
